Growing guide

Preparation

Create or construct a suitable growing bed that is free of weeds, has reasonable texture and structure and can retain moisture. A depth of 75 - 150mm or more is best for supporting the widest range of plant species. Shallow depths (less than 75mm) and 'extensive' growing medium designed for sedums are not usually adequate and will not contain sufficient moisture or nutrients.

Sowing

Seed is best sown in the autumn or spring but can be sown at other times of the year if there is sufficient warmth and moisture. On shallow growing medium irrigation may be needed to maintain establishment through dry periods. The seed must be surface sown: do not incorporate or cover the seed. Bulk up the seed with an inert carrier such as sand to make distribution easier.
